NASA @ My Library STEM Kits



In July library staff will be distributing 200 NASA STEM kits for kids in K-6th grades. Kits will be distributed on a first-come fist-serve basis from 10 am—1:00 pm in the library entry way on July 11, July 18, July 25, and July 31st. Each week will be a different theme. Kits are straw rocket, pinwheel galaxy, marshmallow 3-D Build, and lunar phases. STEM Kits were funded through the NASA @ My Library grant,

which is in its final year.

For Children

We had 56 children register, birth to 4th grade (Fall 2020). Ashley, ECCB,

did 2 virtual programs via Facebook Live, one was on woodland animals and the other on seeds. Weekly STEM kits were handed to those aged K-4th grade., catapults, parachutes, and germinating seeds. Through library checkouts or use of the apps Overdrive and Libby, and attendance at virtual programs, Legos were added to make a Lego creation. Pictures were posted to the EPL Facebook for patrons to see how it grew. Any prizes received were done through random drawings. On June 24th, each participant will receive 2 free books and a finale come and go will be held June 30 via Zoom.

For Teens

Youth in 5th grade and up that had checked out items during the week were automatically included in a drawing for a \$25 Estherville Bucks certificate. We had four lucky winners this summer.

For Adults

Adults involved in this year's Summer Library Program were automatically enrolled in a weekly prize drawing based on their circulation activity. Each week we drew for a \$25 Estherville Bucks certificate, and everyone who had checked items out that week had a chance to win.

We also featured a program we had planned to hold one evening in person, but decided to stretch out across the month so more people

could enjoy it. Cookies of the World featured the baking of dedicated volunteers Lois Creech, Norma Beaver, Brandi Cellan, and Jeanne Handeland. What we continue to offer

We are attempting to keep the library experience as normal as possible, and we appreciate everyone's patience as we all get used to the new procedures. Most of our services are still available:

- Online programs for all ages and access to library board meetings
- STEM kits for children (provided throughout the Summer Library Program in June, and there will be more to come as we announce future kits through the NASA @ My Library series)
- Curbside pick up and curbside printing continue all the hours we are open
- Browsing the collection



- Computer use & printing (30 minutes per day)

- 24/7 Access to a wide array of online services, including free-to-you downloadable e-books, audio books, and magazines
