## For Children

Children who will be in 4th grade the Fall of 2020 and younger are invited to participate in the 2020 Children's Summer Library Program. The program will start June 1st and end June 30th. Program registration has been eliminated this year except for where it concerns the Foam Party.

Read what you want, when you want, and for how long you want. No reading logs or books to keep track of ever. Check out library materials and attend programs to receive Legos. Add the Legos to our Lego Building Challenge. Check back often to see the creative minds at work and how the world changes.

We plan to kick off summer June 1st with Aessop's Tales and Animals presented by Ashley Reed, Emmet County Conservation. The Japan America Society of Iowa will be back this year, but instead of showcasing their drums, will be sharing Japanese masks. Masks will be traditional and anime and along the way attendees will learn more about the Japanese culture, folklore, customs, and traditions. The Science Center of Iowa will also be visiting the library and sharing their version of the theme Imagine Your Story, through science fun.

We will offer one session of Tinker Tuesday in June. The program will be for kids K-4th grade. We will be experimenting with coding. The program will also feature items from our latest NASA @ My Library kit, Code-Pillar-Twist, Code and Go Robot Mouse, and Code Hopper. Another NASA @ My Library program will be Rover Races, We will explorie Mars, Mars Rovers, and then having some fun learning about how rovers move over Mars surface. A highlight will be watching the current Mars Rover building at the Jet Propulsion Lab.

Lego League is on its regular scheduled Saturday and Storytimes are Thuesday nights at 6:00 pm and Friday mornings at 10:30 am. Storytimes include any combination of books songs, fingerplays, rhymes, and a craft or activity.

We will end the Summer Library Program with a Foam Party in Library Square and will be serving root beet floats.
