Sweet Corn Days



On August 7th, 9:00 am-10:30 am, EPL staff will distribute 200 Mosquito Habitat Mapper kits funded by NASA @ My Library. Kits are available on a first come, first serve basis in the front of the EPL (East side). Through the

kit, children and their families will have the opportunity to learn more about mosquitos and their habitats and become Citizen Scientists as they contribute their data to NASA and GLOBE through the free app Globe Observer.

The Globe Observer website has this to say about the Mosquito Habitat Mapper: "By identifying potential breeding sites for mosquitos, sampling and counting mosquito larvae, and by using optional equipment to examine, photograph and identify the genus of your specimens, you will be enabling scientists to verify predictive models of mosquito population dynamics. In addition, public health authorities can use your observations to inform where, when, and how to intervene in their communities to reduce disease risk."

The Globe Observer app is free to download, available in several languages, and has other Citizen Science opportunities. These include clouds, land cover, and trees. Kits include instructions, information, and a cell phone attachment that will enable kids and their families to see mosquitos up close. The magnifier can also be used on its own, without a cell phone.


